Reports: It was noted that the accounts had been fully approved by Honorary Auditor Julian Chilvers. The **Treasurer** reported an excess of income over expenditure to the tune of £693.04, and £2194 in the bank. He thanked team captains for their continued help in collecting subs and match fees.

On the field, an inconsistent season was reported, with all three Saturday sides finishing in mid-table and team captains bemoaning a lack of consistent availabilities. First XI captain, Alex Mutucumarana, for example, reported that his team had used 18 bowlers compared to 5 the previous year, while the captains of the Second and Third XI's reported a reliance on a number of young players. A need to recruit new members and entice old members to return was noted. David Mitchell reported that he intended to implement a selection meeting on a Monday evening, while Simon Gardner hoped for a more meritocratic selection process and a desire for playing members to progress within the club. Andrew Redfern stressed the need for members to inform captains of their availability in advance. Peter Wholley and Lisa Carter were thanked for scoring.
